***African and Black Diaspora*** is seeking to appoint a team of Editors to replace the founding Editors of the journal, who will be stepping down at the end of 2023 after many years at the helm. The roles are planned to formally begin in January 2024, with a handover period with the outgoing Editors until the end of 2023. The term of office for each role is three years in the first instance, with the opportunity for further three year extensions.

These roles are a great opportunity for academics with a strong background in research involving issues of power, knowledge, gender, race or other forms of social identity as they relate to the African diaspora, and who have the commitment, drive and ability to help develop and modernise the journal. The roles come with a modest honorarium and involve dedication, energy and focus. Becoming the Editor of a journal is a rewarding and fulfilling experience where you can draw on and build your own networks, develop and promote research in the fields of African Studies and Diaspora Studies, and be recognised as a leading figure within the academic community.

The Editors will be responsible for oversight and administration of a rigorous and proper peer review process that delivers an agreed amount of content of suitable scope and quality within an agreed publication timeframe. As part of this role, you will use an online peer review and submission system and be confident in overseeing the facilitation of all peer review through this system (training will be provided).

The journal is committed to ensuring diversity, equity and inclusion across the editorial team, editorial board, reviewer network and decision making processes, to represent the diverse research community working in this field. Candidates must hold a PhD in a relevant discipline, but applications are welcome from scholars at all stages of their career. Applicants based in Africa are strongly encouraged to apply.

It seeks to encourage the study of the African diaspora through an inter-disciplinary and comparative framework that illuminates the state of the broad field in critical ways.

The journal publishes research articles, commentaries and book reviews, with scope to also publish other types of research outputs. Publishing three times a year, with a minimum of 16 research articles per annual volume, *African and Black Diaspora* also publishes special issues, where the Editors work with the Guest Editors on an issue focused on a specific theme.
